

Rules for Using Visual Aids:

- 1. Avoid using the whiteboard.
- 2. Prepare visual aids in advance.
- 3. Practice with your visual aids.
- 4. Make sure your visual aids are big enough for all to see.
- 5. Display visual aids where all listeners can see the.
- 6. Do not stand in front of visual aids.
- 7. Avoid passing visual aids among the audience.
- 8. Do not give a handout to your audience while you are speaking.
- 9. Display visual aids only while discussing them.
- 10. Talk to your audience and not your visual aids.
- 11. Explain visual aids clearly and concisely.
- 12. Use your aid during the speech, rather than after.
- 13. Do not put many small photos on one sheet of poster board.
